
Dear Dr. Lynch:

I am writing this letter in support of your grant submission titled, "Feasibility of an Internet-based fertility and early pregnancy study in the U.S.". I agree to fully cooperate with you with regard to the management of subject data. StudyTRAX® will be the database repository for this study. StudyTRAX has been used as a data repository for numerous NIH sponsored research projects and contains multiple levels of security to ensure HIPAA compliance and appropriate user access (access control, audit control, data integrity, user authentication, and transmission security). I will assist with the effort to setup and deploy the StudyTRAX system in accordance with your study requirements and to ensure all data sets are de-identified as defined in the HIPAA privacy regulation 45 C.F.R. §164.514 (b)(2).

We discussed the study design requiring a seamless mechanism to switch subjects from daily diary data collection during the "trying to conceive" phase, to the monthly diary data collection during the pregnancy phase. This will be accommodated through a semi-automated trigger event whereby when subject's report becoming pregnant, an email will be sent to the study coordinator who will then move the subject into the pregnancy study arm (i.e., single click of a button).
